

Johnson's work is political and necessary, drawing attention to the lived Black British experience, and calling out systemic racism, policy brutality and abuse of power.


"the first crossover voice, who made it possible for a generation to think of themselves as black and creative in literature, music, the media" Caryl Phillips

In 2002 Jamaican-born Johnson became the second living poet and the only black poet published in the Penguin Modern Classics series.

As well as several commercially successful and classic albums as a reggae artist, Johnson's volumes of poetry include Dread Beat and Blood (1975), Inglan is a Bitch (1980) and Tings an Times (1991).


## Poetry Writing Workshop With Nick Makoha
